Well done for another great week Cranes!


Class News Robin Class

In Art, Robin Class has been learning how to paint autumn leaves using watercolours, as part of our Autumn 1 project. By the end of the project, we'll have created six beautiful pieces of art and crafted adorable air-drying clay hedgehogs. The theme for this unit is all about *forest friends*, and the students are really enjoying it!

In Literacy, we are continuing with colourful semantics and have started introducing conjunctions linked to the acronym FANBOYS (For, And, Nor, But, Or, Yet, So). We're focusing on "and"

and "because" to help students expand their simple sentences into more complex ones.

In Maths, students have been focusing on answering the question "How many?" and have been encouraged to recognise symbols in number sentences.

We are also working on our pencil grip in art and practicing cutting to make fruit salad in cooking.

Additionally, the students have been using various methods to communicate, such as using communication boards in art, cooking, and science, as well as writing instructions in science.

Sensory integration

Sensory integration is the process by which the brain organises and interprets sensory information from the environment and the body. This includes input from the five senses (sight, sound, touch, taste, and smell), as well as proprioception (awareness of body position) and the vestibular system (balance and spatial orientation).

OT may use activities like:

- Swinging
- Jumping
- Textured materials to help a child better process and respond to sensory information, aiding in the development of more adaptive responses to their environment.



OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

Attention and listening (activities)

Attention and listening skills are important in the development of a child's language, speech sound and literacy skills. You can do the following activities with your child to develop their skills.

- Ready, steady, go activities: Say 'ready steady' and after a
 pause 'go' when playing games such as knocking over a tower,
 throwing a beanbag, playing with bubbles, playing an
 instrument.
- **Simon says**: Take turns giving each other instructions on what to do (e.g., Simon says...touch your nose!).
- Memory games: Take turns saying "I went to the shops and bought...". Add an item on each turn and remember to say the items that have already been named.
- **Switch places if...**: Take turns saying "switch places if" e.g., you have brown hair/a brother/like dancing. Make sure you stand up and find another seat if the statements are true for youself!
